For the following concerns;

- No compelling case for Compulsory Purchase powers to be used to acquire land for non essential infrastructure/hobby railway.
- No economic benefit for surrounding area RVR have admitted this .
- Three new crossings including one on the extremely busy a21 which will cause disruption and be dangerous
- Greater flooding risk
- Distraction of habitants on moat farm which have been untouched for decades
- This is a new railway not a reinstatement as claimed by RVR. The track bed does not exist any longer
- Requests for a public enquiry as the documents appear to be inadequate/out of date
- Noise, smoke and diesel fume pollution from the trains and emissions from cars held up at the level crossings
- The disruption of a great traditional family farm
