I object strongly to the proposal as there are enough issues with the flow of traffic along the A21 as it is with frequent hold ups and heavy traffic. The road leading up to the proposed junction and beyond is single carriageway. A hold up would lead to a back up of traffic to the roundabout with the potential of traffic held up on the island.

I have used the A21 to travel to work for many years and I am convinced that any obstruction such as a rail crossing would make the situation far worse, particularly on a Bank Holiday and on weekends during the summer.

Although I understand that extending the line could be of benefit and a feature that could enhance the provision of a leisure activity – in my view finding an alternative to a crossing with gates on the very busy A21 is essential. Motorists would have every right to object strongly to the proposal. They face enough problems on the road already.
