

- I have been a supporter of the Kent & East Sussex Railway for all my life and I (and my late father) considered the refusal in the 1970's to allow this section of the line to be reopened to have been a mistake.
- The applicants have considered, investigated and ensured that the application will have no adverse effect on the rick of flooding, traffic congestion or local wildlife.
- The re-opening of the railway back to the main-line at Robertsbridge will allow the railway, Bodiam Castle, Tenterden etc. to be visited without a car. As I get older I am already finding the drive to and from this railway, which involves driving half-way round the M25 tiring, and I look forward to being able to do this by train instead, a journey which at times is just as quick and far more relaxing.
- The extensions of the Bluebell Railway to East Grinstead, the Mid Hants Railway to Alton and Isle-of-Wight Steam Railway to Smallbrook Junction, reconnected these railways to the national railway system, without any adverse side effects on the local area.
