The Network Rail (Suffolk Level Crossing Reduction) Order


This note is in response to the drainage maps submitted by Mr Baker on 19 April.

Mr Baker indicates in his email that the maps he has submitted have been taken from the Government long term flood risk information web page (https://flood-warning-information.service.gov.uk/long-term-flood-risk/risk-types). This page comes with the following caveat:

"This information is not suitable for use in land-use planning. If you're planning a development, you must use the Risk of Flooding for Land-Use Planning (Rivers and Sea) for England or Development Advisory Map for Wales. This is information based on flooding without defences."

The maps submitted by Mr Baker only show a general indication of the direction of a drainage flow in an area. They do not show the precise position of drains.

The attached print out from the Risk of Flooding for Land-Use Planning (Rivers and Sea) for England web page (https://flood-map-for-planning.service.gov.uk), indicates that Pound Hill underbridge and the area around it are not prone to flooding.
