Dear Sirs

Further to the receipt of the 'Formal Notice' of the submission of the 'Proposed Cambridgeshire Level Crossing Reduction Order', and the 'Notice of Application for the Temporary Use of Land' (copy attached), sent by Burton Knowles on behalf of Network Rail, which directly affects the land I own to the rear of my property, I would like to make a formal objection.

My objection is based on the following:-

- Following the public consultation in September 2016, the original proposals have been changed with no further consultation or communication with the owners of the properties that will be directly affected. An update was issued in December 2016 (copy attached), which I did not receive or have any knowledge of until I queried the 'Formal Notice' with Bruton Knowles.
- The alternative route originally chosen for the footpath following the closure of the crossing C08 is suitable, and would have no impact on the residents of Queen Adelaide. The changes to the proposals appear to have been made following a small amount of feedback on the September 2016 consultation.
- The documentation sent to me did not give me sufficient information regarding why Network Rail wanted to use my land located to the rear of indicating only that the use of the land was 'temporary'. Having subsequently contacted Bruton Knowles, they have confirmed that Network Rail wish to create a permanent footpath on my land, to which I strongly object.
- The proposed work will leave my own, and adjacent homes vulnerable, as it will create an access to the rear
 of our properties away from sight of the main road.
- I have no wish to sell my land.

I have contacted Network Rail for further information regarding the documentation that has been received, but I have had no response from anyone who is able to give me more details regarding this project.

Anglia Level Crossing Proposals




CO8 – Ely North Junction Ely Parish

Ely North Junction is one of the level crossings in the County of Cambridgeshire. It is located in Ely Parish and has the postcode CB7 4TZ. This is a stop, look and listen footpath crossing where the user has to decide whether it is safe to cross. The railway at this level crossing carries passenger and freight trains with a line speed of 60 mph. There are generally 194 trains passing through this level crossing per day. A photo of the crossing is shown here.


Public consultation was held in September 2016 on the preferred option (at the time) for this level crossing. 6 questionnaire responses were received. Key themes included:

- The footpath is a key link from the settlement of Ely to the wider countryside
- The diversion includes too much road (footway) walking
- The right of way to the east of the railway should be retained to allow access to the woodland area



Our revised proposals are to close Ely North Junction level crossing to all users. Crossing infrastructure would be removed and fencing installed to prevent trespass onto the railway. Rather than diverting footpath 11 along the industrial unit access road to Ely Road, as previously proposed, footpath 11 would be retained up to the level crossing. Users would be diverted, to western Queen Adelaide level crossing to the north, along a new 2m wide footpath adjacent to the railway. The new footpath would be in Network Rail land past the residential dwelling and field margins in private land to the south. The proposal would significantly reduce walking adjacent to the main road. New fencing would be provided between the new footpath and railway and also between the footpath and the field (currently used as a paddock). The existing footpath which runs south along the railway from the eastern Queen Adelaide crossing would be retained, with a short section leading up to C08 being extinguished. An overview of the revised proposals is shown on the drawing overleaf.







Transport and Works Act Order - Network Rail Anglia Level Crossing Proposals

I have recently met with my constituent, Mr. Luke Palmer of F. C. Palmer & Sons, Stowbridge Farm, Green End, Stretham, Ely, Cambridgeshire, CB6 3LF to discuss his concerns about Network Rail's proposals to close a number of level crossings on the land that he farms around Stretham in my constituency. Having seen the site I share his concerns and hope that they will be taken into account when the decision on this TWAO is made.

Mr. Palmer farms 3150 acres of which 1753 acres are on the eastern side of the Kings Lynn to London railway line. There are four level crossings on the land, three user-worked crossings (Nairns No. 117 C02, Jack O'Tell (Adam's Crossing) C33 and Fyson's C34) and a footpath (Chittering C01). All are included within the TWAO for closure and Mr. Palmer's concerns relate to all of the crossings, but especially to the closure of the two main user worked crossings, Nairns and Jack O'Tell.

The first important point is that these crossings are heavily used. My constituent tells me that approximately 1,000 return crossings per year are made over Nairns and Jack O'Tell transporting farm produce in 12 tonne trailers in addition to crossings to access the land for planting, irrigation etc. Mr. Palmer estimates that the these two crossings are used 20-30 times a day in off-peak season and in excess of 50 times a day during the peak season.

As the crossings are so heavily used an effective diversion needs to be possible which does not seem to be the case here. Mr. Palmer tells me that no diversion has been proposed by Network Rail for the closure of the Jack O'Tell crossing and the proposed diversion for the Nairns crossing would involve an additional 2.5 mile journey and put their heavy farm vehicles on the A1123. My constituent tells me that there have been three serious road traffic accidents involving farm vehicles on this road recently and he fears that there will be more if a greater number of journeys need to be made on the A1123. In addition, Mr. Palmer is concerned that the proposed diversion requires access via Little Farm where they have no

legal right of way. Access could, therefore, be denied by the landowner (requiring a 10.3 mile diversion via the A10) or charged for.

Finally, my constituent is concerned that at no point during the consultation process has Network Rail supplied data on how frequently these crossing are used and how many accidents have happened. Indeed, despite referring to the need to improve safety at these crossings, Network Rail have told Mr. Palmer that they have not collected data on the safety record at these crossings. Mr. Palmer says that other level crossings not earmarked for closure have poor safety records and points to the Bannold Road crossing where there have been four suicides in the last three years.

Given these concerns I agree with my constituent that the decision to close these crossings needs to be looked at carefully again. I hope that you will chose not to consent to these closures in the current TWAO and that, instead, ensure that alternative options for improving the safety of the railway as it travels through Stretham are fully explored.
