



- The proposed new route for the footpath and it's extremely close proximity to a poultry rearing building and business units, is of significant concern and the proposed path would bring the general public very close to the poultry building. This causes great concern regarding bio security, particularly in view of the recent Avian Influenza outbreak prior to Christmas and further subsequent outbreaks. No Proposal has been made to what exactly these security measures would be? At present the site can be secured by way of locking gates. The addition of a footpath in the proposed location would not offer the same level of security by nature of the route proposed.
- In addition to this with the farm traffic to the poultry building and the traffic to the business units it presents a significant risk to the general public. I strongly disagree with the comments in your Statement of Consultation. There has been no proposal or suggestions made how the risk will be managed.

Overall the discussions with Network Rail or their representatives have clearly failed to address all the issues and concerns raised.

I hope you will give my views full consideration in your deliberation.
