Subject: Network Rail Suffolk level crossing reduction order. Level crossings S27-Barrells and S28- Grove Farm.

Dear Sir,

With reference to the closures of level crossings S27-Barrells and S28-Grove Farm we have strong objections to the relocation of an existing footpath, (see enclosed plans sheet 11 and 12 that were sent to us on 12th December 2016). We were never consulted about this footpath which will have a profound effect on our life.

Objections

1: Loss of security: The proposed relocated path runs along our west boundary and passes just behind our stables and outbuildings allowing easy access onto our property. (We have previously been burgled) The original boundary was separated by trees and bushes which the owner is cutting down thus removing any boundary between our properties, this boundary is described as a substantial by Network Rail on their final plans. We have previously informed Network Rail and Bruton Knowles of the removal of the trees. (see enclosed photographs x3)

The original path goes past a property called Woodlands which has a 6ft close boarded fence separating it from the path. Will Network Rail be erecting a similar fence along the boundary of the proposed new footpath?

2: Loss of privacy: People using the proposed new footpath will be able to see straight into our house and garden. This will have an effect on our lifestyle and could upset our animals.

We have valuable livestock (mares and foals and eventers) which are securely fenced to the east of our property. We are concerned about people and animals trespassing onto our property, especially upsetting the animals.

Why move the existing footpath since it goes nowhere near the owners house (Popples) and is already boarded around Woodlands property?

There would be no need to build a bridge over the waterway to connect the proposed new path with the highway thus saving money.

We agreed to the plans shown at the final consultation in September 2016 (plan enclosed) and have e-mails sent to us from Network Rail dated 4th January 2017, and Bruton Knowles dated 21st December (enclosed) denying the existence of the proposed path and stating that there were no alterations to the proposals put forward in September 2016.

We have had enormous difficulty getting information from Ardent, Bruton Knowles and Network Rail. The plans sent by Ardent in December contain yellow areas regarding land potentially affected by the order which appears to be partially on our land. On enquiry our point of contact at Ardent or Bruton Knowles could not interpret the plans with regard to where the boundary was.

We finally got a reply from Bruton Knowles on 20th March 2017 (enclosed) but have never received a reply from Network Rail to our last e-mail sent on the 5th April 2017.

We have had 4 different TWAO's since last September!

We have lived here for over 30 years and if this proposal goes through our property will go from having a footpath across one corner to having footpaths down 2 sides, this will affect the value of our property and our quality of life.




We strongly urge you to leave the existing footpath where it is according to the consultation plans for September 2016, failing this we need an adequate fence erected along the boundary for security.



The team who are dealing with the Anglia Level Crossings proposals have advised that there has been some changes to our level crossings proposals since the consultation process was completed. However, the crossing known as Barrells is not one of the crossings where we have made any more changes to our proposals (as outlined during the consultation process). Mr Brace would like to know if this is legal, as there has been no consultation advising that this footpath will be installed? Mr Brace added that Ardent have asked for information to be provided within two weeks as this will be proposed in early 2017.

Customer By Phone (Matthew Johnson) (15/12/2016 10.07 AM). Mr Brace called as he has received a letter from Ardent about the work to put in footpaths near Mr Braces property. He said he has been to all the consultation meetings and seen all the plans but the letter and plans received by Ardent show a path put right down the side of his property. He said this was not on the plans at the meetings. He wants to know if Network Rail can do this, and said what's the point in holding meetings if you just do what you want anyway?

Good morning Mr Brace,

Further to our telephone conversation on Monday, I have now had the opportunity to review the information we have available in relation to level Crossing S27 – Barrels.

From the land registry, I understand that you live at Pheasants Mead off Barrells Road in Thurston and own land until title numbers SK60013 & SK60173 and as you are aware, Network Rail propose to close the level crossing. I have checked the proposals information online and I understand that they propose to create a new 1.5m wide footpath to the north of the railway line/ to the south of your property, within land already owned by Network Rail.

We have been recently instructed by Network Rail as their new land agents on the project and will be working alongside them and Ardent. I have attached the proposal information in relation to level crossing S27 – Barrels and S28 – Grove Farm for your information.

In order to secure the powers necessary to implement the proposals, such as the dedication of public rights of way across private land, extinguishments of existing rights and alteration of rights including downgrading of roads, Network Rail will be applying for three Transport and Works Act Orders (TWAOs) to the Secretary of State for Transport. The TWAO applications will be grouped by county as below and we expect to submit these in spring 2017.

- 1. The county of Suffolk (The Suffolk Level Crossing Reduction Order);
- 2. The county of Cambridgeshire (The Cambridgeshire Level Crossing Reduction Order);
- 3. The county of Essex, the county of Hertfordshire, the unitary authorities of Thurrock and Southend-on-Sea and the London Borough of Havering (The Essex and Others Level Crossing Reduction Order).

To inform the application, they are consulting with the public and relevant statutory bodies. The feedback submitted to them and how Network Rail has taken account of it will form part of a consultation report which supports the, Transport and Works Act Order application.

We will seek clarification from Network Rail that the new footpath falls within land already in their ownership and come back to you but should you wish to discuss this in the meantime, please do not hesitate to contact myself or Andrew Prowse on 0115 9881 160.
