## 1.0 Summary

- **1.1** Our main concern is the impact of the Orders proposals on our farming business.
- **1.2** The creation of new rights of way as diversions are disproportionate in relation to the current use and lost amenity of the proposed crossing closures.
- **1.3** The proposed diversions create new circular routes that will increase the use and impact of the current Rights of Way network.
- **1.4** Incomplete and inadequate engagement of Network Rail and their Agents with Stakeholders particularly landowners and occupiers has significantly increased the length and cost of this process to all parties.
- **1.5** The proposed Order transfers risk and cost from Network Rail to other stakeholders without significant reduction risk to current crossing users along with exposure to new hazards.
- **1.6** The impact of diversion route infrastructure and suitability has not been sufficiently considered.
- **1.7** Late disclosure of stakeholder correspondence and un-consulted changes to proposals has forced a Public Inquiry rather than determination by prior agreement.
- **1.8** Relevant to our objections we propose
  - **1.8.1** <u>S12 Gooderhams:-</u> modifications should be approved exactly as outlined in the published order
  - **1.8.2** <u>S69 Bacton:</u> should not be closed as no suitable lower risk alternative is currently available
  - 1.8.3 S13 Fords Green:- Public foot rights should be extinguished with limited diversionary route modifications as our alternative proposal OBJ26
     Common Ground Proposal S12 S69 (OBJ26 Proof of Evidence Appendix 3)

Comprising of

- **1.8.3.1** A single short (230m) section extinguishment of Bacton Footpath 14 east of S12
- 1.8.3.2 The diversion of regularly disturbed cross field Bacton footpath 20 to a permanent undisturbed route along the field edge and through a copse beside the railway running south from S12 Fords Green to Cow Creek (sic) Crossing
