The Transport and Works Act 1992 Proposed Rother Valley Railway (Bodiam to Robertsbridge Junction) Order

Rother Valley Railway Ltd submitted its application on 19 April 2018 to the Secretary of State for Transport for a TWAO. Further details are set out in the attached notice.

Key points in support of the application:

- Economic benefit to the area, not least to Rother District, East Sussex and Ashford Borough, Kent, estimated at up to £4.1m p.a.
- Benefits achieved without charge on the public purse as the project is being financed by private philanthropists.
- Access by rail from Hastings and London to major tourist attractions in the Rother valley; Bodiam Castle, Great Dixter, Tenterden Town, Sissinghurst and many others
- Employment opportunities for full time, part time and volunteer staff.
- Creation of a protected wild life corridor along the section where the railway embankment was removed.
- RVR has already reconstructed ¾ mile of track at the Bodiam end, ½ mile at the Robertsbridge end and created at terminus station adjacent to Network Rail mail line.

Key points in response to the possible concerns:

- Use of Compulsory Purchase to acquire the historic trackbed from the two farmers who have not yet agreed to sell It should be noted that following the Public Inquiry into the Rother District Plan, the Planning Inspector recommended the use of CP powers to acquire the land from the then 4 landowners. However, over recent years RVR has acquired two of the parcels by negotiation and made generous offers to the 2 outstanding landowners and expressed a strong wish to acquire the land if at all possible, by negotiation.
- Impact of the A21 Level Crossing This would not be closed to road traffic during morning and evening rush hours. Full barrier automated locally monitored, closure would be around one minute, as demonstrated by a similar installation elsewhere.
- Flood Risk to Robertsbridge Extensive modelling validated by Environment Agency shows no increased risk of flooding to the village.
- Ecological translocation of protected and other species Will be managed by specialists in accordance with plans agreed with EA and Natural England.
