Hi Neil,

I confirm the following:

Severn Beach – is in South Glos but we think that it has already been developed.

Avonmouth North West - This is the Kings Weston landfill – associated with both the chemical works and zinc smelter. 80% of it is vertical retort wastes up to a height of 26 m AOD Residues were overlain by granulated blast furnace slag, calcium sulphates are present. Some protection has been afforded to the site in places. Two landfill site permits are active on different parts of this area.

Avonmouth North East – This site is largely built out, so is no longer available for development.

Liberty freight yard – currently occupied by freightliner for rail freight – transport issues round here
