- o Began life in fossil fuelled generation but realised it was leading us to disaster
- Speaking against the expansion of the airport

We are in a climate emergency!

- Declared North Somerset Council & Bristol CC (amongst many others)
- Effects of climate change visible all around (fires in California, floods in Germany...)

> Irresponsible to do anything irreversible

- o atmospheric concentration of CO2: today 416ppm, <430ppm to stay below +1.5°C
- According to Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change...
- o Recent Comprehensive Assessment of Climate Science:
 - Even if the world manages to limit warming to 1.5C, some long-term impacts of warming already in train are likely to be inevitable and irreversible
 - We can stay within 1.5°C but only just only if we cut emissions in the next decade

> Expansion of air travel incompatible with UK Net-Zero target

- UK Carbon budgets 78% emissions reductions by 2035 bare minimum for <1.5°C!
- o Aviation not going to come up with net-zero solutions any time soon
- o Airport's "net-zero" publicity is fraudulent (aim is to increase flying!)

Cost of damage not factored into the cost of flying

- Neither airport nor passengers pay the true cost of the damage they cause
- Cost of impact ~\$3k per passenger per return transatlantic flight (academic study)
- If this was factored in, the airport's true return on investment not so exciting
- (And remember, to them, the Canadian pension scheme, it is just an investment...)

> Impact is global

- o Climate change is a global phenomenon we will suffer in UK, but others more so
- Eg Africa, Asia & low-lying islands where adaptation is impossible

Morally indefensible to act to increase emissions

- UK is one of the biggest cumulative contributors to total level of atmospheric GHG
- Others have greater need and more right to "use up" remaining emissions budget
- And what a terrible example it would set as we approach our hosting of COP26!

> At this moment in history, it would be an unconscionable act to expand the airport

 How to tell our children that we enabled increased flying in the midst of an irreversible climate emergency??
