Thank you for your email dated 5 October.

Firstly, are you able to let me have the signed SoCG?

Secondly, I have responded to your questions below. Please note that the ES refers to up to 6 ADTs; in reality Brett anticipate using 3:

the payload of the haulers - 25 tonnes
the typical return journey time between the quarry and the processing plant - approximately 8 minutes based on an average 550m distance between the quarry and the processing plant
the number of campaign digs per annum – anticipated to be 2 per annum, dependent on water monitoring.
Extraction will take place over circa 100 days in total.
