I am responding to the request from the appeal inspector to comment upon the appeal that is currently being considered.

I am mindful that our National Government has very recently been chairing the COP26 conference looking at all ways possible to limit global temperature increases.

Whilst the establishing of a new quarry on Ellenbrook Fields might seem like an inconsequential event, it will bring with it a significant increase in both atmospheric and noise pollution. This is in addition to the tainting of the local water supply should bromate leach into the aquifer under the site.

The creation of a new processing plant just a few hundred metres from an existing plant and the introduction of the daily presence of diesel fuelled heavy goods vehicles and machinery will all add to an increase in harmful emissions.

I live adjacent to a site which is currently being developed for residential housing. The result is that the noise is constant and both the outside and inside of my home has been invaded by dust emanating from the construction site. At the present time the site is enjoyed by local residents for recreational walking purposes and closing the site would deprive the community of this facility for the next thirty years.

I have previously registered by opposition to this development and continue to hold that position.
