This route and its reinstatement in addition to others closed by the Beeching report cuts is essential for the recovery of the north of England region as would the reopening of railway stations at Killingworth and Forest Hall in North Tyneside and Milnthorpe, Kirkby Lonsdale, Tebay, Sedbergh, Keswick upon Derwentwater, etc, etc in Cumbria.
