At the servicing 'round table' last week, John and I mentioned the upcoming TfL consultation on changes to Borough High Street, St Thomas Street and London Bridge. This consultation is now 'live' at the following link, so I would be grateful if you could bring this to the attention of the Inspector, for her information:

The key headline is that the temporary changes (traffic restrictions) on London Bridge will remain in place during the new experimental period, and the blue barriers which mark out the widened pavements in Borough High Street and St Thomas Street will be replaced with semi-permanent materials. We expect that the construction on Borough High Street and St Thomas Street will take place in autumn 2022.

Below is a GGI of St Thomas Street to illustrate the 'semi-permanent' scheme:



A decision to remove the scheme or retain permanently will be made following analysis of the consultation feedback in early 2023.
