As I understand it, there is no safety case for a double barrier.

In addition, the lengthy time that the barrier will be down will cause long tailbacks on Meldreth Road, with increased air pollution and inconvenience to residents like us who live near the railway line.

Furthermore, we already experience drivers speeding to get across the level crossing as it is, and it's likely that this will get worse with the longer waits.

Finally, given the cost constraints that we are all under, I wonder why money is being spent on something for which there is no safety case.
